PARAGRAPH ORGANISATION IN CAUSE/EFFECT ESSAY

Cause/Effect essays are concerned with **why things happen (causes)** or what happens as **a result (effects)**. It is a common method of organizing and discussing ideas. A well-organized cause/effect essay should consist of:

TITLE

INTRODUCTION

General statements

Thesis statement

Give **your first cause or effect** with a topic sentence and supporting details

Give **your second cause or effect** with a topic sentence and supporting details

MAIN BODY

CONCLUSION

Re-state your thesis statement, using different words
Final thoughts (your opinion, summary of your ideas, your
prediction for the future, etc.)

Introductory Paragraph
